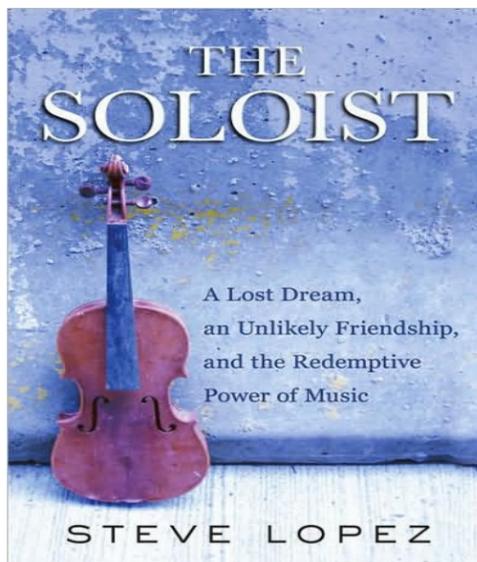

Over the course of the year, more than **2000 people** will experience a housing crisis in Asheville and Buncombe County, and many will experience homelessness.

On any given night, over **500 people** experience homelessness in Asheville and Buncombe County.

People with mental illness, veterans, parents with young children, people with disabilities, and youth are at particular risk of homelessness.
