



DOWNTOWN SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENTS

This project is part of an ongoing effort to improve the pedestrian experience downtown and create a healthy and attractive urban forest by planting and maintaining species of trees that are best adapted for urban conditions.

Sidewalks damaged by tree roots outgrowing planting areas will be repaired and trees causing damage will be replaced with more appropriate species.

It is a coordinated effort between the city's sidewalk crews and arborist to create safe, ADA-compliant sidewalks while maintaining the charm of Asheville's tree-lined downtown streets.
