Wondering what is happening now?

On December 12, 2013, the City sent a [letter](#) to Gated Communities of Asheville, LLC thanking them for their willingness to explore opportunities for a public dog park on private land. The letter further shared that exploration of the site as a publicly maintained dog park has been suspended.

City Staff Summary:

The Friends of North Asheville Dog Park is a group of citizens dedicated to creating a dog park in north Asheville. The group has identified an eight-acre, privately owned property located at 284 Beaverdam Road at the Wild Cherry Road intersection, as the potential site of a future dog park. The property is owned by Arc Development of North Carolina.

On Tuesday, May 14, 2013 the group came before Asheville City Council to request its endorsement of a dog park at this location. City Council agreed to 1) endorse the concept of a dog park, 2) authorize a city staff liaison to work with the group, and 3) authorize \$5,000 to support the concept design of the park. When the design is complete, the Friends of North Asheville Dog Park will present it to the Recreation Advisory Board and to City Council for consideration of construction.
