On Monday, July 21, work will begin on the Craven Street improvement project in West Asheville, a long-term enhancement that will include multi-modal roadway improvements including pedestrian and bike facilities, stormwater Best Management Practices and streambed mitigation, low impact parking and greenway construction and water line improvements.

Background

The Craven Street improvement project is located in the area surrounding the New Belgium Brewery construction site and is the City of Asheville's portion in a public-private partnership with The State of North Carolina, NCGolden Leaf, NCDOT, Buncombe County, The Asheville –Buncombe Economic Development Coalition and others in support of New Belgium Brewing's investment of \$175 million in our community.

- Craven Street Multimodal Roadway Improvements
- RiverWay Connector Segment (Greenway)
- Low Impact Parking Lot and Stormwater Management Area
- Five Points Intersection Improvement
- Craven Street Waterline Upgrade
- West Asheville/Waynesville Avenue Watershed
