### 2014 EARLY SEPTEMBER TO MID-OCTOBER

Craven Street will be closed to complete roadway improvements

### 2014 JULY 21

Construction begins

### 2012 JUNE

Council authorized economic development incentive agreement with New Belgium

### 2012 APRIL

New Belgium Brewing announced their plan to expand by building an east coast brewery at the former WNC Stockyards site on Craven Street in Asheville, NC

## What's happening now?

Work on the installation of the stormwater culvert is progressing but has been delayed because of rain and installation of additional foundation. Due to these delays, Craven Street will be closed to through traffic from Georgia Avenue to Waynesville Avenue for an additional 3 weeks through approximately November 5, 2014.

The Craven Street improvement project is located in the area surrounding the New Belgium Brewery construction site and is the City of Asheville's portion in a public-private partnership with The State of North Carolina, NC Golden Leaf Trust Fund, NCDOT, Buncombe County, The Asheville –Buncombe Economic Development Coalition, the NC Economic Development Administration, the Clean Water Management Trust Fund and others in support of New Belgium Brewing's investment of \$175 million in our community.
