Timeline

2015 JUNE

Estimated project completion and reopening of Craven Street for through traffic

2015 MAY

All water and sewer work is complete.
Craven Street from Waynesville to Hazel Mill Road will be paved and open by mid-May.
Work will begin on section between Waynesville and Haywood Road when that section is open.

2014 NOVEMBER

Realignment of the intersection of Craven Street and Hazel Mill Road completed

2014 SEPTEMBER

Craven Street will be closed to complete roadway improvements

2014 APRIL 21

Construction begins on the Waterline upgrade and multimodal improvement project

What's happening now?

Craven Street from Waynesville Avenue to the intersection with Hazel Mill Road is currently closed. This section will be paved the week of May 4, weather permitting, and opened to through traffic early the next week (May 11). All water and sewer line work is completed. Travelers in the area will experience periodic delays and lane closures as the crews begin work to bring the new road between Waynesville and Haywood Road up to sub-grade. Crews also continue to pour curb and gutter along the closed sections of the road. This section will be reopened after it has been paved in the spring of 2015.

Background

The Craven Street Multimodal Roadway Improvement project is a part of the larger Craven Street Improvement project located in the area surrounding the New Belgium Brewery construction site.

This portion of the project involves Haywood Road to Emma Road, a road section that is currently inadequate for New Belgium Brewing's operations. The road will be widened to the east of the current layout in order to accommodate trucks and to include bike lanes, necessary stormwater infrastructure, and an ADA compliant sidewalk on Craven Street from Haywood Road to the Craven Street Bridge. A realignment of the intersection of Craven Street and Hazel Mill Road will significantly improve transportation navigation issues and increase public safety. A transit shelter will be provided at the intersection of Haywood Road and Craven Street.
