- Speakers are welcome to address the Committee regarding topics of interest.
- Speakers are to address the Committee from the podium at the front of the room, clearly stating their name before commenting.
- Each speaker will be allowed a single period of comment which is limited to 3 minutes.
- A person representing a group of three or more persons (not including the speaker) present has up to 10 minutes to address the Committee.
- All public comment should be addressed to the Committee as a whole. No comments may be addressed to individual Committee members, City staff, or members of the public.
- There shall be no debate on an issue raised during public comment. While Committee Members may pose clarifying questions, public comment is not intended to be a question and answer period. Matters raised during public comment may be referred by the Committee to City staff for review.
