Benefits to Employers: employee transit benefit at low-cost, reduce parking demand, increase transportation equity, and reduces transportation costs.

Benefits to Employees: diversify transportation options, reduces transportation costs.

Benefits to Community: improve transit services, attracts new riders, and improves sustainability.

To qualify: An employer should have over 50 employees, be within City limits and provide employees an employer I.D.


Cost: Employer is invoiced quarterly, at a reduced rate, based on employee ridership. City provides maximum per year cost based on estimated ridership

How to get started:

- A. Contact City
- B. The City will provide employer a quote based on the number of employees and the employees home addresses.
- C. City will provide a maximum expenditure quote based on: 5% of employees with ½ mile of a transit route at \$.52/ride at 10 riders per week per year.

More resources for employers:

- US Federal tax code (IR Code Section 132(f)) enables employers to:
 - Pay for commuting expenses for transit, vanpool, parking, and biking
 - Allow employees to set aside income on pre-tax basis to cover transportation costs, like a 401 (K).
 - Share the cost, with the employer providing a pre-determined subsidy and the employee electing a pretax deduction up to the monthly maximum.

ART (Asheville Redefines Transit) provides bus service throughout the City of Asheville and to the Town of Black Mountain with 16 bus routes running generally from 5:30 a.m.-10:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Routes originate from the ART Station, located at 49 Coxe Avenue in downtown Asheville (next to the U.S. Post Office).

- All buses have bike racks.
- All buses are ADA compliant with wheelchair lifts.
