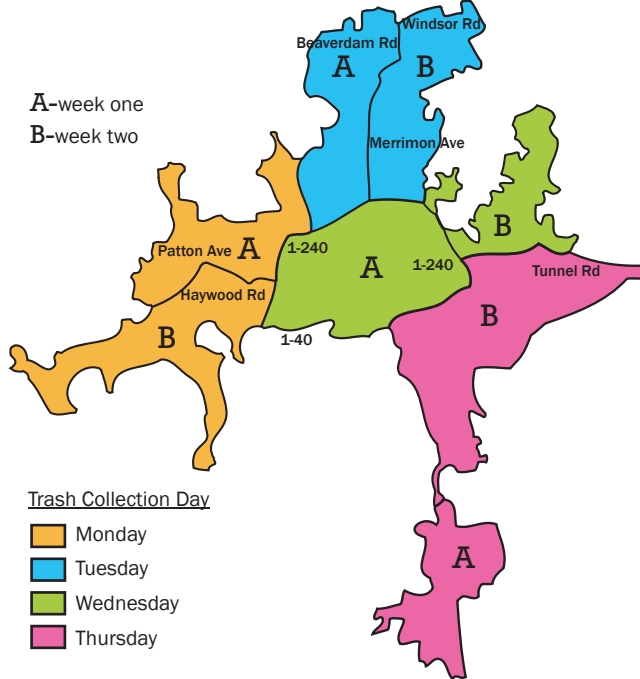


Determining Your Recycling Collection Day

Recycling is collected the same day of the week as garbage collection, except it is collected every other week. You can determine which week your recycling is collected by viewing the map below or by calling Curbside Management at (828) 252-2532.

City of Asheville Recycles

Make recycling as easy as 1, 2, 3!

First, decide on a storage area. The kitchen, where most household refuse originates, is an ideal place for a home recycling center. Put it in a place where you'll remember to use it such as under the sink or in a closet or pantry. A location in the garage or near a back door can also be used for storage.

Second, take every opportunity to fill your recycling bins with properly prepared recyclable materials. You will be provided with two recycling bins: a green bin for metal cans, plastic, glass, newspaper and corrugated cardboard; and a blue bin for mixed paper including paper grocery bags, catalogs, cereal boxes, junk mail, magazines, etc.

Third, place your recycling bins at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regularly scheduled, bi-weekly collection day. If you have more recyclables than will fit into your bins, place extra materials in a reusable, open container next to your bin so it is not confused with trash. A maximum of six (6) bins per household will be collected. To purchase extra recycling bins, call 828-252-2532.

Need a new bin?

If you have more recyclables than will fit into your bins, place extra materials in a reusable, open container next to your bin so it is not confused with trash. A maximum of six (6) bins per household will be collected. To purchase extra recycling bins, call 828-252-2532.

Asheville Recycling

What to Recycle and How:

GREEN BIN:

- Metal Cans (Aluminum, steel, and tin)
- Empty Aerosol Cans Only (remove plastic cap)
- All Plastic Bottles
- Glass Bottles and Jars (Brown, Green and Clear ONLY)
- Newspaper and Newspaper Inserts
- Corrugated Cardboard (Broken down and flat)(Size Limit= 4'x 3' x 12"stack)



BLUE BIN:

- Brown Paper Grocery Bags
- Catalogs
- Cereal Boxes
- Construction Paper
- Egg Cartons
- Envelopes (Paper)
- Envelopes with Plastic Windows
- Frozen Food Box (White Inside)
- Glossy Paper
- Junk Mail
- Magazines
- Manila Envelope with Clasp
- Office Paper
- Paperback Books
- Phone Books
- Post-It-Notes
- Shredded Paper (Place in paper bag with top closed)
- Soda or Beer Cartons
- Toilet & Paper Towel Rolls
- TV Guides
- Wrapping Paper

Special Wastes

Lead-Acid Batteries	C and D
Motor Oil	D only
Tires	D only
White Goods (stoves, refrigerators, A/C, freezers, all metals)	C and D
Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics	D only
Non-infectious medical waste	C only
Wood Waste	D only

Special Waste:

Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics

City of Asheville Residents may take their HHW and electronics to the Buncombe County landfill every **Friday between 9am and 3pm** at a special drop-off area at the Landfill, excluding weeks with a holiday. Each week, we accept electronics from residents at no charge. Businesses will also be able to drop off electronics, but special arrangements need to be made prior to acceptance, contact the Solid Waste Department prior to arrival. Businesses are assessed a fee for electronics recycling. **Proof of County residency is required.**

The following items must be separated out of loads and brought to the electronics recycling area:

- VCR's & DVD Players
- Copiers
- Fax Machines
- Telephones
- Stereos
- Calculators
- Cell Phones
- Video cameras
- **Televisions**
- Computers (**Monitors**, CPU's, keyboards)
Limit 3 per month



Household Hazardous Waste is also accepted on Fridays 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.:

- Paint & paint related items such as water sealer, paint thinners, enamels and polyurethane will be charged at \$2.00 per gallon.
- There is no charge for pesticides, herbicides, insecticides, motor oil, antifreeze and lead acid batteries.
- No hazardous wastes from businesses will be accepted.
- Bio-Hazardous materials, radioactives and explosives are NOT accepted at any time.

Other Efforts:

Recycling Fluorescent and Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs

Residents can drop off used compact and regular fluorescent lightbulbs at any of the following participating municipal and volunteer fire departments: If you have broken fluorescent lamps they are also accepted. **BULBS FROM BUSINESSES OR SCHOOLS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT THE FIRE DEPARTMENTS.**

Residents have two other options as well, they can drop off compact fluorescent lights at the customer service counter of any Home Depot store or they may also order at-home fluorescent tube and compact fluorescent bulb recycling kits from Waste Management at www.thinkgreenfromhome.com.

- Please note: if any of your bulbs are broken please sweep up the contents. DO NOT use a vacuum cleaner. It will spread vapors and contaminate the vacuum. Place the contents in a ziplock bag, wipe the area with a wet paper towel or cloth and bring it to the Fire Station.
- Please make sure the broken bulb and towel are sealed in the plastic bag when brought into the Fire Station. Ventilate the room where the lamp was broken.
- When the unit is broken the mercury is released. It is released as a vapor and there will be very little left in the powder.
- 100% of these lamps are recycled.
